EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

ShareLove.Fund is a free nonprofit yoga school dedicated to empowering women by providing free yoga teacher certification programs to juniors, pregnant, and incarcerated women. Through our instructors and affiliated yoga schools, we offer all five (5) Yoga Alliance teacher training certification programs including RYT 200, RYT 300, RCYT, RPYT, and continuing yoga education. Our certification courses operate year around in New York and during school breaks at various retreat locations.

To fund our operations we (i) sell merchandise, (ii) accept tax deductible donations, and (iii) sell our yoga certification courses to those who do not qualify for a fee waiver. In addition, to fund our outreach operations, ShareLove.Fund offers yoga classes and certifications, mindfulness continuing legal education (CLE), and mindfulness Real Estate Education Courses (REEDC) to the general public for a course fee. Our instructors are licensed to teach both NYS CLE and REEDC. Our fee driven courses serve both to empower women members as well as provide valuable fundraising for our organization. We have come to this dedication of practice of business via the following considerations:

- A NEED TO EMPOWER WOMEN, PARTICULARLY YOUTH IN OUR COMMUNITY,
- INSPIRE AND PROVIDE VOCATIONAL YOGA DEGREES AS WELL AS JOB PLACEMENT SUPPORT, AND
- REDUCE RECIDIVISM THROUGH THE PRINCIPLES AND TEACHINGS OF YOGA TO INCARCERATED WOMEN.

BUSINESS SCOPE

SHARELOVE.FUND IS A NONPROFIT CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION FOCUSED ON EMPOWERING WOMEN WHILE TEACHING ANY NUMBER OF THE FOLLOWING SKILLS: LEADERSHIP, YOGA TRAINING, AND CONFIDENCE. THE MOST PROMINENT FEATURE OF SHARELOVE.FUND ORGANIZATION IS THE ABILITY TO COACH AND TRAIN YOUNG WOMEN TO BECOME YOGIS. SHARELOVE.FUND PROVIDES THE TOOLS AND TECHNIQUES FOR GIRLS AND WOMEN TO EARN THEIR YOGA TEACHING CERTIFICATE. THE SIGNIFICANCE LIES WITHIN THE SANCTUARY THAT IS CONNECTION WITH ONESELF AND OTHERS IN THE PROGRAM WHILE EARNING THE TOOLS THAT COULD ONE DAY INSPIRE OR FOSTER A YOGA BUSINESS OF ONE OF OUR STUDENTS. WE ARE AN INCLUSIVE ORGANIZATION MEANING THAT WE ARE ACCEPTING OF ALL WOMEN REGARDLESS OF RACE, RELIGION, SOCIOECONOMIC BACKGROUNDS OR AGE. HOWEVER, WE FIND OUR PRIMARY DEMOGRAPHIC ARE AT-RISK YOUTH IN ORDER TO HELP THEM CONSTRUCT A POSITIVE PATH FOR THEIR FUTURE.

SHARELOVE. FUND WILL HELP AT-RISK WOMEN HONOR THEIR BODIES BY FOCUSING ON THE CORE PRINCIPLES OF YOGA. FIRST,

- Asanas will be taught so that the women prioritize proper exercise to keep their bodies healthy, strong, and flexible.
- Second, *Pranayama* will be a focal point as proper breathing is quintessential to regulating mood and stress, and by learning how to breathe properly the pregnant women will have an additional tool to help them navigate childbirth.
- Third, Savasana is vital as relaxation is important to remove these women from the "fight or flight" zone that many live in as a constant state of being and, allowing the body to release in a state of relaxation, will empower the at-risk women to "respond" as opposed to "react" in order to make better decisions for their futures.
- Moreover, proper diet and nutrition will be incorporated into the curriculum in a practical and cost sensitive manner. Finally, the power of positivity and meditation is vital to improve their chances of success by visualizing their goals. Not everyone is college-bound, and so often women feel entrenched, enduring domestic violence. This certification program provides at-risk women with a free or low-cost solution, to improve their options in life.

Additionally, ShareLove.Fund will offer Continued Learning Education (CLE) courses as an supplementary asset for our students and cohorts to utilize. This auxiliary offering was brought about by the personal careers of many of our board members and associates. We wish to aid women to reach their goals and via the utilization of our team's educational resources and vast experience in the workplace as both an inspirational and authentic tool.

THEY OFFER FREE AS WELL AS SUBSCRIPTION BASED LESSONS AND TECHNIQUES FOR TEACHERS TO INCORPORATE INTO THE CLASSROOM. WHILE THEIR MAIN TARGET IS ALSO THOSE WHO ARE UNDERPRIVILEGED, THEY SERVE ALMOST EXCLUSIVELY ELEMENTARY AGED CHILDREN. CURRENT PERFORMANCE

During the inception period of ShareLove.Fund, we saw \$54,685 in revenue via contributions through our donors. This revenue period consisted of two months (November and December 2020). After expenses including: program services and management and general, our net assets were \$10,888 for the end of the period. Furthermore, the cash and cash equivalent value for ShareLove.Fund was \$13,388 for the period ending December 31, 2020 (see Appendix). Based on this inception period alone, ShareLove.Fund is in a great financial position to further our mission statement and we look forward to a stellar 2021 fiscal year.




CODE OF ETHICS


